This notice is addressed to students who have not met the minimum attendance requirement necessary to be eligible to sit for the Year IV Semester I End-Semester Examination - 2026.

Please check the list containing the attendance percentages, and the relevant students are hereby required to submit their appeals as follows:

- Students with attendance percentages **between 60%-69%** should submit their appeals to the respective Departments on or before **14th July 2026**.
 - Appeals relating to Labour Law, Jurisprudence and Civil Procedure to the Department of Private and Comparative law
 - Appeals relating to Research Methodology and Criminal Procedure to the Department of Public and International law.
 - Appeals relating to International Trade Law and Energy Law to the Department of Commercial law.
- Students with attendance percentages **below 59%** are required to appear before the Appeals Board for Examinations of the Faculty of Law on **17th July 2026** at 12.00 noon at the Board Room, Faculty of Law.

Students must submit their appeals to the respective departments and/or appear before the Appeals Board with the following documents:

- Written appeals addressed to the respective Heads of the Departments, and/or the Appeals Board for Examinations of the Faculty of Law; and
- All relevant supporting documents, valid evidence, and proof in support of the appeals.

All students with attendance percentages below 70% for any subject should be prepared to appear before the Appeals Board on **17th July 2026**, if required to do so at short notice.

Failure to submit the relevant documents and/or appear before the Appeals Board on the specified date and time will result in the student being deemed ineligible to sit for the examination.
